

On Friday, Pastor Burcham, Senior Pastor, will be teaching the lay leaders and the two pastors on how to construct messages that relate to their culture.



W hat started out as a small-family project, spilled to a neighborhood, then to a small group and landed at Gloria Dei as a project known as Giving Tree. A few years ago, Joy and Clayton Linquist decided to provide Christmas presents for a family in need; on Saturday, Dec. 16 more than 30 families received groceries, gifts and toiletries as the Family Life Center was lined with presents given by members of Gloria Dei.

Joy's stories are almost as abundant as the gifts that were given. She tells about losing a family's phone number and how the family reached them at a very late date. Joy considered telling them it was too late for adoption, and then a family from Gloria Dei "just happened" to inquire about adopting a family.

"It was amazing," said Joy. "When I was ready to give up on a family because of not having the correct phone number or other details, God wouldn't let me. God wouldn't let us quit. He wanted to reach out to these people."

She also tells of a small group who adopted a family of six and was able to provide for everything on the family's list except for two bicycles. The group decided to put the two bike tags back on the tree, praying that somehow the need would be met. When the adopted mother picked up the pres-

ents on Saturday, she was overwhelmed by the generosity of gifts, which included two bikes.

Joy begins planning for Giving Tree in October when she meets with Lisa Scherer, Lori Martin, Nancy Wiggins, and Stacy Howe. They

receive families from Agape Pregnancy Center, Lutheran Social Services, and Hope Ministries and word of mouth. This year they made a few changes though. In an attempt to live out the Gloria Dei's mission of bringing Jesus Christ to people for the first time and a life time, they encouraged the adopted families to pick up the gifts at church instead of having the gifts delivered. They also included information about the Christmas story, the church and spoke encouraging words to the families.

"We wanted to give people more than just gifts," said Joy. "We wanted people to experience church in a positive way and to know that Christians care about them."

She also incorporated her three boys, Alexander, Allen and Jackson into the outreach. They invited all the neighborhood children to a "Wagon Pizza Party," where 17 children ate pizza and listened to a simple gospel message before heading out with their wagons to ask neighbors for non-perishable food items.

"It was great," Joy said. "The children asked lots of questions about God afterwards."

The blessings of the Giving Tree extends beyond the adopted families. When Laura Ammann's family decided to adopt an entire family, they experienced the importance of giving.

"We wanted to teach our children the importance of not keeping everything to themselves," said Laura. "At first, we thought it was too much to adopt an entire family, but once we made the faith step, we were amazed how blessed our entire family became knowing that we were helping another family. It was amazing."
