Forgiving Myself

As we learned last week, God has commanded us to forgive others. As we live life, we realize it is not an easy feat. Neither is forgiving ourselves.

Take David, for example. His perfect resume as a king unravels when he stays home from battle, sleeps with his neighbor's wife and commissions a death sentence on Bathsheba's husband, Uriah.

But the thing David had done displeased the LORD. 2 Samuel 11:27

David's transgression was exposed when Nathan, the prophet, showed up on his doorstep to confront him.

You did it in secret, but I will do this thing in broad daylight before all Israel.
2 Samuel 12:11

At this point, David's life was in ruins and his sin was about to be disclosed throughout his kingdom. David really messed up—a dictionary definition of a mess-up. I can relate.

A few months ago, I designed a holiday postcard for the church. I quickly typed it up and forgot to do a spell check, which is contrary to common sense and my college training. We printed 800 cards and mailed them. The next week, a service technician used my postcard to demonstrate the magnification capabilities of our new printer. My postcard became a full-size poster, which we temporarily hung in the front office.

The next morning, the staff was gathered in the front office when someone innocently mentioned the two misspellings, which were now magnified by 400 percent. In one sweeping moment, I tore my transgression off the wall and tried to gallantly march into my office before my complete meltdown occurred. Pastor Burcham noticed my predicament and said, "No one is perfect. Don't beat yourself up. Just let it go and move on."

I followed that advice. But do me a favor—if you still have the holiday postcard on your refrigerator, throw it away!

On a much larger scale, David also moved from his transgression and confessed, "I have sinned against the Lord." He then prayed and asked God's forgiveness as recorded in Psalm 51:1-3:

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

God forgave David and David accepted God's forgiveness and moved forward with his life. Consequences did occur, his infant son died; but David began a renewed walk with the Lord. It is after this episode that David is remembered as a "man after God's own heart."

God's forgiveness was larger than David's sin. It is also larger than any of our sins or mistakes. If God can forgive us, then we should be able to forgive ourselves—with or without misspellings.





Upon further conversation with Pastor


Bameka, Steve discovered the pastor's desire to incorporate a more blended service to their traditional service. As conversations developed, the idea of a worship conference for 32 churches in Uganda was conceived.

After much prayer and consideration, Gloria Dei has decided to help Pastor Bameka. To better understand their worship styles, vision and culture, a \$5,000 grant by the Iowa Dis
