### A Biblical Act of Service

Today marks our last message on "Family Values," where we have covered practical ways to connect with our families. Whether it is finding time for casual talks, meals, games, movies or service opportunities, it is vital to connect with the families that God has given to us.

In light of spending so much family time together in the last month, you may have noticed that the family is a perfect place to practice God's precepts—most notably love and forgiveness. Think about it. It is relatively easy to love those you don't live with. But how about our extended-stay roommates whose history may be marked with undesirable habits, attitudes or words? Not to mention those fun little personality quirks.

Let's look at a similar situation—Jesus with his disciples. They spent countless hours together in a variety of situations. And if you recall, most of those situations did not reveal favorable traits of the disciples. In fact, the list of offensives was rather long. And yet Jesus showed them his love in an act of service—he washed their feet, their dirty, grimy and filthy feet.

Jesus' affectionate act was completely opposite from the acceptable societal norm; they should have been washing his feet for it was the responsibility of the lowest of servants to wash their master's feet. Jesus, the only one who is worthy of being served, performed this lowly task as an example for us to follow:

Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. John 13:14-15

"You should do as I have done for you," these nine words should inject new life into all of our family relationships. Just think what he has done for us.

Forgiveness: When we were dead in sins, he forgave us. Love: When we were completely unlovable, he loved us. Grace: When we deserved punishment, he gave us grace.

Jesus masterfully gives us everything that we need. Then, he gently encourages us by this act of service to give away to others the rich gifts that he has deposited into our lives.

*Be kind and loving to each other and forgive each other just as God forgave you in Christ. Ephesians 4:32* 

Isn't the family unit a perfect environment for the re-gifting process?

### The Call Process

What? The pastor got a call? Does that mean he's leaving us? Since the call process is unique to church ministry and not found in the business world, it can often be misunderstood. God has given congregations the right to choose and call a pastor to carry out the work of teaching, preaching, and administering the Sacraments (Baptism and Lord's Supper) in their midst and on their behalf (i.e. Acts 1:21-26; 2nd Corinthians 8:18-19). When a congregation calls a pastor, it means that the congregation desires that particular pastor to do ministry on their behalf. At any time, a pastor might receive a call, whether he is looking for one or not. The pastor who receives the call needs to prayerfully discern whether God wants him to continue his ministry at his current place or go to the calling congregation. He can accept or decline the call.



#### Nursery

Infants to age 3. Located on the lower level, access is through the doors in the narthex. The nursery is staffed during all worship services for children ages 3 and under at no cost to the parent.

Located in the southwest corner of the narthex is a room with a full view of the sanctuary for parents to take their small children when they are upset or crying.

**Junior high: Castaway:** For our junior high youth in grades 6-8, we have a high-energy educational time, Castaway, in the Youth Center Sunday at 9 a.m. and 10:50 a.m. **Senior high students**: Our senior high youth in grades 9-12 are invited to a small group study from 9-10 a.m. in rooms 132-36 this week.

### Weekly Bible Reading: Matthew 25:34-40
