Congregational Meeting Called

A congregational meeting has been called by the Governing Board of Gloria Dei for Sunday, March 1 at 1 p.m. in the Sanctuary. The purpose of the meeting is to decide if the congregation would like to call a candidate from the Seminary, as we did with Pastor Meyer, or to fill the position of Director of Adult Ministries with a pastor from the field.

Four years ago the congregation called a candidate who would graduate that spring from the Seminary. By calling a candidate to Gloria Dei, we believed we were fulfilling the part of our vision to be an equipping center for the church at large. We understood that a candidate usually remains in his first congregation three-five years, but felt that Gloria Dei would serve as a training ground for a young pastor and equip him to be more effective in ministry if he decided to accept a call to another congregation. This has certainly been the case with Pastor Meyer. He has served our congregation well, been mentored by Pastor Burcham, matured in ministry, and is now ready to lead his own congregation.

Since Pastor Meyer has accepted the call to Mt. Olive Lutheran Church, we must again decide how to fill his position. We can either call a candidate from the Seminary or call a pastor who has experience in the field. The timing is tight, but possible for us to call from the Seminary if we choose to go this route. Requests for a candidate must be turned into the District president by the end of February. This means that review of candidates and interviews needed to be completed by the middle of February. With this short timeframe, some preliminary work needed to be completed prior to the congregational meeting on March 1. The work completed to date is as follows:

- A congregational profile, job description and a copy of our Strategic Plan was sent to the placement office of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis to see if there were some candidates that could serve our needs.
- Pastor Burcham and Executive Director Bill Jesse reviewed profiles of the 10 candidates.
- Pastor Burcham traveled to St. Louis to interview four candidates on the campus of the Seminary and one candidate by phone.
- The Governing Board has formed a call committee according to the by laws of our congregation. The committee consists of the following individuals: Wally Haase, Becky DeVries, Nancy Schwartz, Connie Cook, Darwin Bartels, Marv Deer, Tim Mueller, Marv Rohn and Laurie Peterson.
- The Governing Board has called a congregational meeting for Sunday, March 1 at 1 p.m.

If the congregation decides to call a candidate from the Seminary, we will need to take that action during the meeting on March 1 and send the necessary paperwork to the District president.

If the congregation decides to call a pastor with experience, we will ask the District office for a list of names and the members of Gloria Dei will be asked to submit the names of pastors we should consider.

Strategic Plan Updates

Land Selection Progress: In the last several months, the Facilities Focus Group has diligently searched for parcels of land that will meet the criteria and the assigned weights in the site selection matrix completed with member feedback from last fall's town hall meetings. They have been working alongside the architects at SVPA to determine what piece of land would best meet



the needs of the ministry at Gloria Dei. The SVPA and the Facilities Focus Group are performing due diligence, examining topography, zoning, costs, potential building and parking lot placements and identifying the pros and cons of each property.

When all the research and data is fully completed, the Facilities Focus Group will present its final recommendation to the members of Gloria Dei in a series of cottage meetings planned this spring.

Meanwhile, it is vital to keep the entire process and teams in your prayers as we desire to have "God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

With Adversity Comes Opportunity

Tim Mueller has been a member at Gloria Dei for 40 years and has recently been displaced from a local insurance company, where he worked for 20 years. Tim has been married to Ronda for 19 years, and has three children, Jessica, Sarah and Marisa. Tim desires to help those who are unemployed, so he has joined the ministry action team that is forming a concrete plan to help those in need. The following is a letter from Tim:

Have you or someone you know been affected by the downturn in the economy? Of course, we all have in one way or another—some more directly than others. Be it job loss, furloughs or the mere unrest of wondering if your job is safe—you are not alone.

It's estimated that 73,000 Iowans are currently unemployed, many of whom are right here in our community. The ones you know about are those who are able to talk about their situation. There are a whole lot more you do not know about because their pride might be holding them back, they are embarrassed by their situation or frankly they are still in shock and overwhelmed not knowing what they are going to do or even where to begin. You are not alone!

Jeremiah 29:11 tells us, For I know the plans I have for you, plans to prosper you and not harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. During difficult times such as these, it is easy to forget that it is not about you or me but what God has planned for us. You are not alone!

My name is Tim Mueller. I'm 41 years old and was recently laid off. This is a brief look into my dealings with job loss. My prayer is that by revealing my situation, you can put a face on this issue that is affecting so many families.

For the last 20 years I worked for a large insurance company in West Des Moines. This was the first and only full-time job I have had since graduating from college. When I learned of being laid off I was devastated. I experienced all the emotions one would expect, given the circumstances. (In retrospect, I believe all these emotions are necessary as part of the recovery and re-entry process.) Over the next couple of weeks my days were consumed with anger, fear and bitterness to the point where I was not sleeping at night and felt like I had a pit in my stomach. Aside from the obvious financial impact, the reality of not having insurance set in. These two issues, along with many others, needed immediate attention. But I found out that I am not alone.

The turning point for me, outside the support of family and friends, was a referral I received from a friend. He told me about a group of people who meet once a week to network and share their trials, tribulations and victories that had occurred during the previous week. Based solely

on his recommendation, I followed my gut and attended a meeting. I can't express what an impact that hour and a half had on me. I left the meeting with a totally different outlook than when I arrived. There we sat sharing, confiding and, yes, giving thanks for what we did have. It was a positive outlook on a negative situation that completely changed my perspective. I am not alone!

The Bible tells us, Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. If you do this, you will experience God's peace, which is far more wonderful than the human mind can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus. – Phillippians 4:6-7. You are not alone!

I invite you to be part of a new small group meeting at Gloria Dei that begins on Thursday evening, March 5. My prayer is that you will be able to find peace as I did, as it relates to your situation. This group is for those who are employed, unemployed, between jobs or just looking for something different. It will be a group of Christ-centered, like-minded individuals who are experiencing a lot of the same things. If you or someone you know is going through similar struggles, I encourage you to join us.

Praise be to God, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we

ourselves have received from God. – 2 Corinthians 1:3

No matter what your situation... you are not alone.

Weekly Bible Reading: Matthew 17:1-9

After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus.

Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah."
