Sixth Sunday after Epiphany

Refinement under Pressure

This week candy will be given, cards exchanged and maybe even a diamond or two will be slipped onto someone's finger. Valentine's Day is Wednesday and the television commercials blast that "Love is in the air." Diamonds have been a symbol of love between couples for hundreds of years, but have you ever thought about how diamonds are produced? One Web site states, "Diamonds form starting at depths of about 150 kilo-

meters (90 miles), where pressure is roughly 5 gigapascals and the temperature is around 1200 degrees Celsius (2200 degrees Fahrenheit)." Although my mind does not fully grasp the exact reality of a gigapascal (one source states that the pressure would cause 20 to 25 cars to be crushed into one square-foot box), nor the intensity of 2200 degrees Fahren-

heit, I do know that a diamond begins out of rough, hard material and goes through extreme conditions before it becomes a shiny, brilliant stone.

Today, as we conclude our series of messages on how God turns problems into possibilities, we will focus on how God refines us through life's extreme conditions. We have already examined the importance of praying, focusing and trusting the Lord when faced with life's pressures.

Although God does not enjoy our pain, he does

use it to make us stronger. In II Corinthians 12, Paul sought the Lord three times to remove an annoying problem from his life. The Lord replied:

"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for

Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." II Corinthians 12:8-10

In the midst of a seemingly impossible situation, Paul turned to the Lord. Did God leave him? Did God say, "Hey, Paul, you are really smart, can't you figure this

one out on your own?" No, instead the Lord revealed that his power is made perfect in Paul's inability to handle the problem. Paul soon relied on God's grace and strength to help him endure the harsh elements of life and in the end Paul became stronger.

Similarly, God will never leave us when problems show up at our doorsteps. We can rely on God to help refine our bodies, which are made from the dust of the earth, into something beautiful that shines for him.

A Continued Partnership in Uganda

Gloria Dei recently awarded a scholarship to fund the education of Waako Yeko, a 33-year-old seminary student from Uganda. This scholarship was introduced and approved at last year's annual meeting as a continued partnership with the churches in Uganda. The scholarship interviews were conducted by the president, officer and pastor of the Lutheran Church Mission of Uganda; Yeko was one of the many applicants. Yeko's story and call to ministry are captivating as evident in the following interview conducted by Jennifer Simpson during her recent trip to Uganda.

Waako Yeko is passionate about the opportunity to gain knowledge that will match his desire to share God's love and grace. Although his life has been filled with hardship, he feels he was called to preach about the greatness of

God. Yeko was married with two children until his wife died several years ago in a tragic accident. In recalling the incident, tears roll down his cheeks at the memories of his loss. Apologizing for those tears, he explains that due to this hardship he was unable to provide for his two daughters, Namughnzed Esther, 7, and Nabirye Restetuta, 9, and had to place them under the care of his sister and aunt. Waako's parents have also died.

Life is not good, he states, but God is the Father and gives strength. "I call for my Father and he knows how to guide me," says Yeko, "I wish to share this understanding with others." Waako was not raised in the Lutheran Church; he was raised Catholic until he converted in 1994 when the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod came to Uganda.

Yeko says he experienced God's love in a profound way

when he met John Duetsman, a LCMS evangelist. During his studies with John, he felt God's love, which encouraged him to grow. Soon he began to feel strongly about pursuing God's calling in his life. In 1995, he studied to become an evangelist and was commissioned to share the Word as an active evangelist in 1998.

Yeko is thrilled to begin his three-year journey at the seminary in South Africa in February and is looking forward to his fourth year when he will be a vicar (intern)

in Africa.

Please remember Yeko in your prayers. Over the next four years, we plan to keep the congregation informed about Yeko's learning and progress.








Kindergarten Information from Urbandale Public Schools
