The Trust Factor

Two girls were adopted from Russia by a couple I know. One child adjusted to life in Iowa while the other triggered upheavals in their household. This 9-year-old girl would scream at night, refuse hugs and defied most of the household rules. It soon became apparent that this girl's younger years were twisted with abuse, abandonment and neglect. For years, her loving adopted parents took painstaking steps to show her the depth of their love.

"She's had failed relationships in the past, which makes it hard for her to build trust," said the father. "Because she didn't trust us, she would try to do

everything on her own. She never wanted help with anything."

From the outside looking in, I wonder why this little girl doesn't let go of the past, which is thousands of miles away, and embrace the love of her parents. Will she ever let go and trust her parents? I realize the answer

is easy for me because I understand the motives of her parents—they simply love her with no strings attached and no hidden agenda. They only want to drench this little girl's heart with love and support. She, on the other hand, is still haunted by the torment of her past and does not trust the ample supply of her parent's love.

Now her predicament sounds more familiar to me.

How easy is it to trust after you have been hurt and battered in life? Doesn't it require us to forsake our mistrust and doubts and place everything we possess in unfamiliar waters? Isn't that what God wants us to do?

It isn't easy. After all, some of our old habits and self-sufficient ways seem to work fine, and to be honest, do not like to be kicked out in the cold. Yet, God implores us to abandon all and trust him.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6

What a great promise. We trust and acknowledge him and he will make our paths straight. He will straighten us up! There is more to this promise though:

Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord and shun evil. This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones.

Proverbs 3:7-8

According to this promise, our bodies will benefit when we leave our own

wise-self at God's door step and trust him.

My friend's daughter is still in the midst of daily trust struggles but recently a breakthrough occurred; while undergoing medical tests in the hospital for an acute infection, she left her uncertainties long enough to comply to the doctor's instructions as she clung to her parents' hands. "She looked to us for support and strength, and we were there for her," said the father.

Likewise, God will always be there for us with open and supportive hands as we leave our doubt and trust him.

I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." Psalm 91:2



IRS Charitable Contributions Changes

A member pointed out some interesting changes in the IRS charitable giving rules that will be effective for the 2007 tax year. We certainly are not experts in this area, but we can point out the changes and urge you to seek counsel in how it applies to your tax return.

- 1) Charitable contributions cannot be deducted for the 2007 tax year without written documentation of the contribution. The IRS states that a donor cannot claim a tax deduction for any contribution of cash, a check or other monetary gift made on or after Jan. 1, 2007, unless the donor maintains a record of the contribution in the form of either a bank record (such as a cancelled check) or a written communication from the charity (such as a receipt or a letter) showing the name of the charity, the date of the contribution, and the amount of the contribution.
- 2) For 2007 only, if you are 70 1/2 or older and are taking a required distribution from your IRA, that distribution can be directed to a charitable organization and the IRA-holder will not have to pay taxes on that amount. The IRS states in part: A qualified charitable distribution is a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of an IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an organization eligible to receive tax-deductible contributions. You must have been at least age 70 1/2 when the distribution was made.

There are more details to both of these items, but we wanted to give a brief summary and encourage you to seek a tax professional or the IRS regarding all of your charitable giving.
