Relief Need Refocused During January and February

Matthew 25:35 "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink"

As the Advent sermon series asked us to consider, "Who is our neighbor?," we are asking Gloria Dei members to temporarily refocus our relief efforts during January to our local community. Due to the large local and statewide

outpouring of support for the Gulf Coast Disasters, local community assistance programs have suffered significant decreases.

One such assistance program is the Des Moines Area Religious Council (DMARC). DMARC provides food to eight sites in



central Iowa. The cost of supplying eight sites with five days of three meals/day is \$10,000. We want to impact the needs of DMARC in a significant and profound way. We are asking the members of Gloria Dei to either supply the specific food listed on the flier being distributed by the ushers today, or make a cash donation to help those who are hungry.

The Christmas Stable will remain in the narthex during January and serve as the collection area for food products. In addition, a chart displaying the growth of cash donations will be posted. Please visit the Christmas Stable with your gifts for our neighbors.

God has blessed us as a congregation. He called and guided our responses during September, October and November to the Gulf Coast disasters. While we are not abandoning our on-going support of the Gulf Coast, we are in the short-term focusing on the need in our local communities. Please help those who are in need.

Watch for information about a February focus on worldwide hunger and Gloria Dei Youth's 30 Hours of Famine campaign.
