If you are like me, the memories center not on the meal itself, but around the relationships being nurtured and built. The mealtime serves as an environment where the family comes to the table with their mixed bag of imperfections producing unique and lasting memories.

Weekly Bible Reading: Matthew 26:17-22;26-30

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Where do you want us to make preparations for you to eat the Passover?" He replied, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, 'The Teacher says: My appointed time is near. I am going to celebrate the Passover with my disciples at your house." So the disciples did as Jesus had directed them and prepared the Passover. When evening came, Jesus was reclining at the table with the Twelve. And while they were eating, he said, "I tell you the truth, one of you will betray me." They were very sad and began to say to him one after the other, "Surely not I, Lord?"
