Movie Night

There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. Galatians 3:28

For the majority of Americans, buying or renting DVDs is a popular form of entertainment. In fact, home video has become the most popular way for Americans to view the latest movies. Last year consumers spent \$23.7 billion buying and renting DVDs, far surpassing the \$9.7 billion that moviegoers spent at the theatrical box offices. In 2007, with more than 90 million U.S. households owning a DVD player, home video accounted for 56.5 percent of studio revenue from movies. So, with the high demand for DVD movie entertainment, a video store has to offer a wide variety of movies choices to satisfy every age group and interest. Their movie inventory should range from romance, drama, science fiction, comedy, horror, and let's not forget the old-time westerns and classics. Most successful video stores will have movies available for all kinds of people.

From a much larger viewpoint, God makes himself available for all kinds of people. The apostle Paul tells us that God is a God for everyone. Everyone? In Galatians, Paul lists title after title—Jew, Greek, slave, free, male, female—it doesn't matter who we are, what title we carry, or what background we may or may not have. What really matters is that we are the same in Christ Jesus. More importantly, God stands on the same plane with each of us no matter what plot has thickened in our lives. Dealing with an addiction? Been divorced? Made a major mistake? God is still God. Spent all your money? Cursed God? In a rut? Having relationship problems? Or are all the details in your life working harmoniously together? God is still God.

It's comforting to realize that whatever scene in life we are in, the director of our life, God, promises never to leave us. We can take heart knowing that God doesn't look at our past, our mistakes or life circumstances. He doesn't even judge our lack of Oscar-winning performances. In fact, in his viewing pleasure, God looks at us and sees in the words of Paul that we "are all sons (daughters) of God, through faith in Christ Jesus."

Now that is a documentary movie that deserves a standing ovation.

Weekly Bible Reading: Matthew 18:1-9

At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?"

He called a little child and had him stand among them. And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
