Family Values

Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another... ---Hebrews 10:25

One of our family's precious memories was the day Michaela, our oldest daughter, first started to ride her bike without training wheels. Her eyes were wide with excitement as she started down the sidewalk and she beamed, proud that she was able to do it, "all by myself." I should say that I saw the whole thing. I wasn't around. I was at a meeting that day. I missed out on a family memory. It happens to all of us. We don't want it to happen, we wish it didn't. But it does.

Making family relationships a priority is tough. Finding time to be with family can be a challenge and oftentimes the family can be put in second, third or last place in the demands for time. It's difficult in this day and age. We talk about quality time and then spend that quality time glued to our Blackberry or locked behind the earphones of our iPods. Nevertheless, family connections are important; hence, the reason for our new sermon series, "Family Values." God designed a family to be a cohesive nucleus where God's love for each family member is fully realized.

In the next five weeks, we are going to challenge one another to carve out time for our families and treat it as precious, because it is. We'll encourage each other to do something together as a family. Whether it's playing games, watching a movie or serving together, the focus will be on carving out time during the week to meet together. The writer of Hebrews understood the importance of gathering: "Do not stop meeting together..."

How do you define family? Is it a nuclear family with the husband, the wife, the children and the dog? What about those who have never married, or those who are widowed? Jesus describes family in this way, "whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother" (Matthew 12:50). Fellow believers are defined as family.

To help encourage the gathering of fellow believers, we have a sign-up table in the narthex that will help to form small groups for the duration of this sermon series. So, whether you are single, widowed, an empty nester, or if your family is not nearby, you can still experience the weekly activities suggested within the confine and comfort of a small group.

This week's first challenge: Find a night to have a family meal. No TV, radio, books, newspaper, phones, only total attention on the family. Spend time together in our families and make memories that each family member can be a part of. And please let your family know what you thought of the time together.
