Thousands of volunteers showed up in Des Moines to sandbag and help the initial clean-up of the affected areas. Likewise, the eastern part of Iowa has seen a surge of volunteers as national organizations, such as the United Way, and other smaller grass-root efforts have come together with one goal in mind: to restore Iowa.

Burianek. When he heard about the 5,400 houses that needed help, he rolled up his sleeves and started to compile a list of homes that needed immediate help. "It is mind boggling to see the neighborhood that I grew up by become so devastated," said Burianek. Soon the list of homes became much longer than any group could possibly handle, so he joined forces with an organization, Hands On Disaster, which helped in the rebuilding after Hurricane Katrina.

Currently, Bill's efforts have helped 80 houses and his list has 40 more. When asked if he still needed help, he said, "Yes and double yes." Other organizations, such as the United Way, the Corridor Recovery and Vineyard USA Mercy Response have organized the deployment of volunteers for the initial clean-up of hundreds of houses. And they are still calling for volunteers.

Year-end Financial Review

Here are a few highlights from the past fiscal year that ended June 30, 2008:

Income: Our final year-end total income was \$1,673,000, which was about \$46,000 under our budget but \$162,000 higher than the previous year–primarily due to increased offerings and an increase in preschool income due to more students.

Expenses: Our expenses were \$160,000 below the annual budget.

Current Financial Picture: As we enter into the new fiscal year, we began the summer season where our giving has historically gone down at the same time our expenses increase in preparation for the fall kickoff of programs. It is worthwhile to note that due to the generosity of our members and good stewardship of our resources, we enter this period in a better cash flow position than we have for the past several years. In addition, we continue to pay down the existing debt on our property and operating loans and fund all programs, all while increasing our support of local, national and international missions.

An important aspect of our G.R.A.C.E. vision is to be an equipping center where leaders are trained. Last year, we initiated a conference to

help smaller churches incorporate some of the multimedia tools that we have been privileged to use at Gloria Dei.

Shining City Foundation and Gloria Dei Provide Help

Shining City Foundation is a 501(c)(3) charity with which Gloria Dei has worked on several missions-related projects in China.

Shining City Foundation got its start in 1998 when two Gloria Dei members, Scott Raecker and Brad Peyton, were introduced to a Christian couple who had been living in China and working with an orphanage in Yunnan Province. The couple had helped the orphanage take in abandoned children, in some cases literally rescuing newborns from dumpsters in back alleys. Through their efforts, care for the orphans, particularly infants, was also greatly improved and mortality was reduced dramatically.

Raecker and Peyton were so impressed with the couple's work, they decided to seek financial support for the many humanitarian projects the couple had been doing in China. Beginning with a series of smaller projects designed to improve living conditions at another orphanage in China, Shining City Foundation began to take shape.

Eventually, with the aid of grants and financial support from Grinnell College, Rotary International and members of Gloria Dei, Shining City Foundation has been able to: provide housing for over 60 orphans, develop a farm that is capable of providing food for nearly 300 orphans, develop and equip a medical clinic that serves a rural village of about 5,000 people, provide solar-powered water heaters, medical supplies and bedding for a rural school for over 400 children, and provide ongoing educational scholarships that continue to support over 200 students.

In 2001, Raecker and Peyton traveled to China to see the work being done there first hand. This initial trip inspired subsequent trips in 2002, 2005 and 2007 to review progress on existing projects and to plan new ones. Gloria Dei members who participated in one or more of those trips included: Scott and Martha Raecker, Deb and Dan Timmons, Andy and Marilyn Varley, Jared and Mary Walter, and Brad Peyton.

With the earthquake in Sichuan Province earlier this year on May 12, many new challenges and opportunities to introduce Christ to the people of China are emerging. With the help of Gloria Dei and its members, Shining City Foundation is already responding to those needs. "So many people were willing to give more money because it was a good cause," Kayleigh commented. She is now more dedicated to doing more to help those less fortunate. "This is only the beginning" she said at the end of the car wash.

God calls all of us differently to serve him. It's not a question as to whether he calls us; it's what he has called us to do. Kayleigh and Justin are simple teens who heard God's call and took action.

HerStory Camp Teaches Girls about the Past and the Present





Nursery
