# Welcome Pastor Robarge

#### The Installation Service

We are pleased to welcome Pastor Robarge to Gloria Dei! Last Sunday, he was installed as Associate Pastor during a service in the Sanctuary. He will serve as Director of Adult Ministry and Associate Pastor.

Pastor Robarge's father, Rev. Daryl Robarge, a LCMS pastor for 35 years preached at the service. Rev. Robarge explained that during his first years of ministry his youngest infant son, Philip, was rushed to the hospital and how

the members from his congregation prayed throughout the night. The following morning the infant started to eat, which "has never stopped," he jested.

#### Pastor Robarge's Story

Even with a strong Christian upbringing and his junior and senior high school years spent at a Lutheran school, Pastor Robarge did not even consider full-time ministry. However, his father's work as a chaplain at a local police department inspired him to pursue a degree in criminal justice with a minor in psychology at Northern Arizona in Flagstaff, Ariz. His dream was to establish a career in the FBI or in a local police department.

But his career choice was challenged when two officers were shot shortly before his daughter was born.

"My family and my career choice were not matching up," Pastor Robarge said.

He decided to put his career on hold and began to work for Lutheran Brotherhood and then for Thrivent Financial for Lutherans as an insurance/stock and bond representative.

Meanwhile, his wife, Heather, whom he courted throughout high school and college, taught at a local public school and became aware of an abusive situation of one of her students, Laura. After reporting the situation to the police and failing to find a healthy living arrangement for Laura, the Robarges became permanent guardians and eventually adopted her. (Continued on page 6.)

"So now I was married for two years, with a one-year old and a 14-year-old and then my wife became pregnant," said Pastor Robarge. "Under those circumstances, we grew up fast as individuals and as a couple. It pushed us to make sure that we were raising our children correctly. We wanted to make sure they were receiving the knowledge of God in a stable environment."

During that time, both Heather and Pastor Robarge were active in his father's church with many people suggesting the seminary to him. But those suggestions didn't resonate with him until a retired pastor sat him down and said, "We are all Christians with a job to do, what is yours, Philip?"

That question spurred a conversation with his father about going to seminary. "I have been thinking about you going to seminary for three years, but didn't want to bring it up to you because I didn't want to pressure you," his father stated.

After surviving his first 12-week course in Greek, the seminary years became grounds for great learning and inspiration. His vicarage was spent at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Freeport, Ill. where he served the congregation of more than 800 by preaching, teaching, presiding over

weddings and funerals, and making hospital calls.

Under the senior pastor's tutelage, Pastor Robarge observed how to lead quietly by motivating people to discover their gifts and then releasing them to work in the kingdom of God.

As far as hobbies and interests, he is an avid sports fan, particularly the Dodgers and the Lakers and thoroughly enjoys reading an assortment of non-fiction books, with a special fondness for the simplicity of John Ortberg's writings. Because his mind is usually engaged with lots of thoughts, he finds movies extremely relaxing. Among the top of his list is the Monty Python series, action movies and historical documentaries.

"I learn a lot from conversing with people," he said. "I am looking forward to listening, thus learning from the people at Gloria Dei."

In addition to getting to know people, he is excited to preach and teach. He especially

is fond of studying a particular chapter in the Bible and then facilitating group studies around the chapter.

In recent years, Gloria Dei has partnered with the Shining City Foundation by providing financial support to help build churches. Currently, one church is completed and serving the poor of the region. Construction of the second church is underway. The following are excerpts from the missionaries in the area about the new church and the effect it has on individuals who are getting to know Jesus.

# **Remote Church Outreach**

Construction of a second church in a remote area has already begun. I cannot reveal the location or give names concerning it at this time.

This new facility is in a very remote place where the worshippers will have to hike through the mountains for several hours to meet together for worship with others in the area, but they don't complain.

There are two results that are pretty unique for this area. First, we are working with one group of believers in a distant location to facilitate the building of a church for another group of believers far from them and crossing people group boundaries. So it is one indigenous church sharing his 'image' with another indigenous church.

Secondly, this same group facilitated the building of a previous church and out of that some wonderful results have come. The Lord has given them the desire to outreach in other ways to these remote believers. They are assisting some of the mountain children with school fees, so they can continue their education. They also help with other daily needs as they arise.

Friends, your faithfulness has not only assisted the church here, but has given birth to a vision of cooperation between two entirely different groups of believers from different backgrounds and cultural areas. His 'image' has been displayed and multiplied into true visible Christ-like servanthood between believers.

### **Tibetan Miracle**

God uses your faithful partnership to share his 'image' and create miracles. This is just one of his miracles (Note: names have been changed).

A Chinese believer (Lao) who we work closely with, was asked by a mutual friend we both know, if he would be willing to call and befriend a young Tibetan man (Tsering) who lives and studies in a remote city of Tibet. He said, "of course."

Lao made contact with the Tibetan student and they began a friendship. Lao began to help Tsering with small needs in his life.

During vacation Tsering brought a classmate, who was a young lady, to meet Lao and his wife. She was on the verge of quitting university studies. Lao and his wife began to help the young Tibetan lady as well and encourage her. She chose to stay in school.

Tsering observed all of this and said to our friend Lao, "You are different, your family is different and my other foreign friend is different, why?" Lao explained we are Christians and it is the love of Christ that makes the difference.

Tsering became convicted about his own life and said to Lao, "I want to be like you; I want to know this Jesus." Tsering accepted the Lord and gave his life to Christ. He was baptized last July.

You see, you are faithful in sharing his 'image' with others around you. Praise God for this new Tibetan life in Christ! Please pray for his continued growth in the Lord!
