I can remember very vividly the news stories and the talk surrounding the turn of the clock on December 31, 1999. It was the infamous Y2K scare. The world is run by computers and the computers are all going to crash because they are not programmed right. This would have a world-wide domino effect that would result in the destruction and devastation of the world's population. The world would come to an end! Fear had spread.

In the history of the world there have always been people who have attempted to predict the end of the world. The wonderful Disney character, Chicken

Little, is famous for his portrayal of the apocalyptic messenger who is delivering the bad news. Times have not changed. Recently it is the Nostradamus and Mayan calendars that have aligned to give us the most recent date for the end of the world set for 2012.

Lots of questions arise when discussing the end times. Is the end near? What will happen to me? What will happen to my loved ones? What will life be like when Jesus comes back? Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:1a-2 (NIV)

Jesus does instruct us to "keep watch" and "be ready" for he will come back for us. Until then, we live not out of fear, but live boldly by praying, reading and hearing the Word and speaking about the Savior to the world.

We do not have to be afraid of the end times, or for that matter, any time that we are facing. Jesus reassures us that "in the world you will have tribulation. # Welcome Pastor Robarge

We are pleased to welcome Pastor Robarge to Gloria Dei! On Sunday, July 12, he was installed as Associate Pastor during a service in the Sanctuary. He will serve as Director of Adult Ministry and Associate Pastor.

### **Pastor Robarge's Story**

Even with a strong Christian upbringing and his junior and senior high school years spent at a Lutheran school, Pastor Robarge did not even consider full-time ministry. However, his father's work as a chaplain at a local police department inspired him to pursue a degree in criminal justice with a minor in psychology at Northern Arizona in

Flagstaff, Ariz. His dream was to estab-

lish a career in the FBI or in a local police department.

But his career choice was challenged when two officers were shot shortly before his daughter was born.

"My family and my career choice were not matching up," Pastor Robarge said.

He decided to put his career on hold and began to work for Lutheran Brotherhood and then for Thrivent Financial for Lutherans as an insurance/stock and bond representative.

Meanwhile, his wife, Heather, whom he

courted throughout high school and college, taught at a local public school and became aware of an abusive situation of one of her students, Lau-

ra. After reporting the situation to the police and failing to find a healthy living arrangement for Laura, the Robarges became permanent guardians and eventually adopted her.

"So now I was married for two years, with a one-year old and a 14-year-old and then my wife became pregnant," said Pastor Robarge. "Under those circumstances, we grew up fast as individuals and as a couple. It pushed us to make sure that we were raising our children correctly. We wanted to make sure they were receiving the knowledge of God in a stable environment."

During that time, both Heather and Pastor Robarge were active in his father's church with many people suggesting

the seminary to him. But those suggestions didn't resonate with him until a retired pastor sat him down and said, "We are all Christians with a job to do, what is yours, Philip?"

That question spurred a conversation with his father about going to seminary. "I have been thinking about you going to seminary for three years, but didn't want to bring it up to you because I didn't want to pressure you," his father stated.

After surviving his first 12-week course in Greek, the seminary years became grounds for great learning and

> inspiration. His vicarage was spent at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Freeport, Ill. where he served the congregation of more than 800 by preaching, teaching, presiding over weddings and funerals, and making hospital calls.

> Under the senior pastor's tutelage, Pastor Robarge observed how to lead quietly by motivating people to discover their gifts and then releasing them to work in the kingdom of God.

> As for hobbies and interests, he is an avid sports fan, particularly the Dodgers and the Lakers and thoroughly enjoys reading an assortment of non-fiction books, with a special fondness for the simplicity of John Ortberg's writings. Because his mind is usually engaged

with lots of thoughts, he finds movies extremely relaxing. Among the top of his list is the Monty Python series, action movies and historical documentaries.

"I learn a lot from conversing with people," he said. "I am looking forward to listening, thus learning from the people at Gloria Dei."

In addition to getting to know people, he is excited to preach and teach. He especially is fond of studying a particular chapter in the Bible and then facilitating group studies around the chapter.

So please, when you see the Robarge family in the hallways, give them a warm welcome.

On Friday, July 10, eight youth and four adults headed out to Ashland, Montana for our summer mission trip. We joined approximately 400 other campers in Ashland knowing only one thing... God was going to do great things through us. We were separated into workgroups (64 total groups of six workers) and were assigned specific projects, such as painting houses, working on roofs, building porches and wheelchair ramps, and hanging drywall. My crew insulated and hung drywall for the Tallbull family as we enclosed their garage to make another room for them. Each day we would focus on a part of Luke 4:18-19, "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach the good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." We saw that we are the ones who need to see better, to be freed from our sins, to be released from those things that are weighing us down and dictating to us our behaviors.
