# **Recipe for Witness**

Wouldn't it be great if a manual was written giving us step-bystep instructions on how to share our faith?

Perhaps, it could be entitled "The Book of the Planned Acts." Chapter One would read: Step One: Get out of bed. Step Two: Find someone who looks lost. Step Three: Take a deep breath and introduce yourself. Step Four: Ask the question: If you were to die tonight, would you go to heaven? Step Five: Quote John 3:16 with as much gusto as you can muster.

Of course, such a detailed manual would prove to be inefficient because it does not allow for an important element that God takes into consideration—we are all individuals. Take the unique steps that God created to reach Cornelius, a devote Jew, in the real book of Acts. While Cornelius was praying one afternoon, an angel told him to send for a stranger named Peter. The following day, Peter was praying on top of the roof and received a disturbing vision of a large sheet containing all kinds of animals and reptiles followed by a command to "get up, kill and eat." Peter, who had been taught not to eat certain foods, quietly refused this unusual request three times when a knock occurred at the door by Cornelius' servants. As the story unfolds, Peter visits Cornelius and begins to understand the rooftop vision.

"I now realize how true it is that God does not show favoritism but accepts from every nation who fear him and do what is right." Acts 10:34-35

Peter then begins to share about the crucified and resurrected Lord, which resulted in Cornelius' entire house believing in Jesus.

"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came on them as he had come on us at the beginning." Acts 11:15

Obviously, the prescribed steps in the book of Acts are written for specific individuals by a caring and loving Lord. Although we can never duplicate the exact steps that caused an entire household to believe, we can learn great principles from the account, such as prayer and obedience. They both prayed and were receptive to listening to God's directions even though it contradicted their understanding.

We can also ask the questions: How willing are we to listen to God's voice? Can the Lord direct us to a Cornelius? We believe he can. It probably won't be in the exact way that Cornelius was reached but because of God's loving desire to save all people, he will guide our steps to them.

# **Proposed Bylaw Amendment**

Last March, the Governing Board piloted a new voting process by setting up expanded voting times and informational meetings for the Strategic Plan vote. More than 40 percent of our congregation participated in this process, which is a significant increase from the normal Sunday afternoon voter's meeting.

The Governing Board received positive feedback concerning this voting process; therefore, they propose the following title change and amendment addition to the bylaws to be inserted in article II after number 4. These two modifications will be voted on at the annual congregational meeting Sunday, June 22 at 1 p.m. in the sanctuary.

#### **Proposed Bylaw Amendments:**

### 1. Title Change:

Changing title of Article II from, Meetings of the Congregation, to, Congregational Proceedings.

#### 2. Text Insertion:

5. Voting process: Unless otherwise stated in a procedure to be followed or referenced in other Articles, members may vote by casting ballots at a designated voting location over a designated time period approved by the Governing Board. The use of absentee ballots is acceptable. Those members casting ballots shall constitute a quorum. A vote may only be taken, after the congregation has had opportunities to review information and attend informational meetings on the matter to be voted upon. Proper notification of the informational meetings, voting date(s), which shall include the hours, and voting location, shall consist of written announcement at weekend worship services for at least two (2) consecutive weeks, prior to such events.

This new voting process could be used for the following items in Article I requiring a vote. The first one is the reason for requesting this bylaw amendment; the last two would be affected as they do not have specific procedures in place:

### Article I

- 3. Acquisition or Disposition of Real Property
- 4. Incurrence of Indebtedness
- 7. Excommunication of a member of the Congregation

It does not change the existing voting process for the following items in article I that require a vote:

- 1. Calling a Pastor
- 2. Removal of Pastor
- 5. Election or Removal of Members of the Governing Board
- 6. Ratification of the Annual Budget
- 7. The Amendment of the Constitution and By Laws

Current bylaws can be located on the Web site on the Governing Board page. The Governing Board is committed to making the voting process as accessible as possible to the congregation because they believe that each vote will provide long-term direction to Gloria Dei.

Informational meetings to review this amendment as well as the budget will be held on June 8 at 10 a.m., June 14 at 6:30 p.m., and June 18 at 6 p.m.

# **Work in Honduras**

**The Reason for the Trip:** For several years, members from Gloria Dei and other churches have joined forces with the World Gospel Outreach (WGO) to help the poor in Honduras. In June, 21 members from Gloria Dei and six members from Lord of Life Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota will once again partner with this organization.

A Glimpse into One Team Member's Story: Bill Clark's original request to be on the Kentucky mission team in 2005 landed him in a foreign country. After finding out that the Kentucky mission trip was no longer available, he opted to jump on board the team that was headed for Honduras.

"I thought it would be a good adventure at first; but when it got closer, I wondered what I got myself into," says Bill.



Even though he was hesitant at first, Bill's experiences on his first trip proved to be eye-opening as he had never visited a third-world country before.

"I realized that most of the world doesn't live like we do," says Bill. "But the first day that I helped with the medical brigade, it completely changed my perspective. I wanted to help these people, and in return, they were so appreciative."

Since his first trip, Bill has traveled to El Salvador to help build houses for Habitat for Humanity last year and is slated to help again June 6-15. Five days after he returns, he will travel for the fourth time to Honduras with the team from Gloria Dei.

"I guess what I really enjoy is the simple form of giving that occurs on these trips," says Bill. "We provide the service, and don't expect anything in return."

Like many other individuals from the team, Bill highly recommends for everyone to travel on at least one mission trip, because it helps to change one's perspective of the world.

"I now see how I fit into the world," says Bill. "I see that my life is actually small compared to the need that is out there, but my life becomes bigger as I help those in need."

Please keep Bill in your prayers this week as he travels to El Salvador.
