A Response to The Da Vinci Code

According to Barna Research, a polling organization, *The Da Vinci Code* has been read "cover to cover" by one out of every five American adults. Since the book was first published in 2003, it has sold more than 46 million copies. By comparison, Stephen King's most recent novel had an initial printing of 1 million copies, and John Updike's next book will have a first-run printing of 150,000.

In the book, Dan Brown claims the following:

- Almost everything the church teaches about Jesus is false.
- Jesus was only human. No one claimed he was divine until a church council in the fourth century declared him God.
- Jesus was married to Mary Magdalene.
- Mary was pregnant when Jesus was crucified.
- Their offspring are alive today, a secret kept by the Priory of Sion.
- The Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, are just four among 80 or so other gospels.

On his Web site, Brown writes that *The Da Vinci Code* is a "novel and therefore a work of fiction. While the book's characters and their actions are obviously not real, the artwork, architecture, documents and secret rituals depicted in this novel all exist."

Let's look closer at Brown's claims:

Was Jesus' deity created by the church in the fourth century? Brown purports: the Council of Nicea in AD 325 created a Jesus who was not only human but also God, Jesus only regarded himself as human and never claimed to be God, and the Emperor Constantine and the church fabricated such doctrine. However, we know that the Council of Nicea debated some important issues and even confirmed Jesus' deity, but did not create the concept. Christians had been worshiping Jesus and proclaiming his deity for centuries before the council. In addition, the New Testament already explicitly claims Jesus' deity in John 1:1; Colossians 1:15 and Hebrews 1:3.

Were the four Gospels of the Bible arbitrarily chosen from among more than 80 gospels?

Matthew, Mark, Luke and John are by far the oldest and most reliable records that are rooted in eyewitness accounts of Jesus. These other so-called gospels were written decades later and contain a fanciful outlook of Jesus. Brown claims these other gospels did not emphasize Jesus' deity, but regarded him only as a man. However, in reality, the Gospels convey a more human Jesus than these later "works." In addition, other outside sources such as the historical account of Josephus, confirm the picture of Jesus found in the Gospels.

Let's Get to Know Charles Jackson

Gloria Dei was an unlikely match for Charles Jackson and his family when they moved from Florida in 2000. His Baptist background would have prevented him from considering another denomination, but his involvement with Promise Keepers magnified the Biblical truth concerning the reality of the one body of Christ—God views all believers as one body and not separate denominations. He immediately appreciated Gloria Dei's scripture-based min-

istry, the gospel readings, the traditional hymns, the worship services, the music ministry and the fellowship with other members. So, before he became a member, he became involved by teaching Sunday school.

"I believe to expand my worship experience, I needed to jump in feet first and

"You must always give it everything you have," says Charles.

Together they promote family by being involved with their sons, Jacob, 14, and Alex, 12, in church, school, camping, music, reading, gardening, bicycling and Boy Scouts. Although work, church and school keep the family busy, they firmly believe that children learn more from "what you do than from what you say." Thus, they are committed

to incorporating Christ's teachings into every fabric of their lives.

Charles' family values were shaped by his childhood experience of being the son of a Baptist minister who preached in small towns throughout central Texas where he was raised. And even though at times the family struggled with finances and the time spent traveling to and from pastoring small churches, Charles learned an incredible life lesson: "From my childhood, I carry the sense that all things are

possible with God," says Charles. "God has and does provide. Everything my wife and I do, we do after prayerful consideration. It is reassuring to know that whatever I'm going through, I have Christ—that he is able to give me guidance when I don't have the right answers."

Charles became a member of the Governing Board last year and has enjoyed the discussions concerning

the church's future. "It has been a great experience. Tackling complex tasks and seeing them through to completion is something that I really like to do," Charles says.

When he is not involved with family or church, Charles volunteers for Boy Scouts and Habitat for Humanity, reads historical, civil war, biographies, current leadership and future trends books, watches old western and adventure movies and loves to be outdoors. In the midst of all of these activities though, Charles says he would like to leave his children the legacy of the importance of joyfully serving others and faithfully living out the teachings of Jesus. "God has blessed me and continues to lead me toward the plan he has for my life," Charles comments.

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at Gloria Dei in the belief and with the confession that this Sacrament is the very body and blood of Christ (The Doctrine of the Real Presence) which is received with the bread and the wine for us to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our faith. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and seek to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us. If you agree with our beliefs regarding the nature and meaning of this Sacrament and desire to commune with us, you are welcome! For the medical and/or physical needs of members or visitors, non-alcoholic wine will be in the inner circle of each communion tray and will be lighter in color than the regular wine.
