Let's Meet Gloria Dei's Executive Director

With a plethora of experience both in the academic and business realms, along with a great passion to help further God's kingdom, Bill Jesse began his first week as Executive Director. The Executive Director's primary responsibility is for the overall management and day-to-day operations of the congregation's ministry and staff; thus to further the mission and vision of the church.

"God has been so good to me that I wanted to give back something to my God," said Bill. "I am excited about this opportunity and am looking forward to using the talents and skills that God has given me to assist and move the ministry forward at Gloria Dei."

Bill started his career as a teacher for a self-contained seventh grade classroom; he then spent the next 33 years serving school districts in northwest Iowa as a teacher, principal, athletic coach and a superintendent. When asked why he choose a career in education, he immediately replied, "The kids!" He said that

he often sought out children to mentor and encourage that did not have good or stable homes. "To make a difference in a young person's life is an incredible blessing," Bill said.

He retired in 2005 for seven weeks and decided that his "honey-do" lists would not suffice his need for human interaction, so he began work for Allied Insurance as a training supervisor. He then accepted a position at Ameriprise Financial as an operations manager.

Bill and Sue, his wife of 37 years, are actively involved with the families of their two married sons, who live in the Des Moines vicinity. Dan and Lisa have two daughters, Kiara, 4, and Kasey, 2; and Dave

and Angie are expecting in February and have two sons, Benjamin, 3, and Bryan, 2.



Christmas Program 2008

Journey with us as we hear again the words of Isaiah, Matthew and Luke through an exciting adventure.

What should people expect? This year's program is for the entire family. Children ages 2 years old through high school



seniors will tell the Christmas story in a traditional and contemporary way. Audience members will travel from site to site where children and youth will present the story from the Bible.

The audience will start in the Family Life Center where junior and senior high youth will begin

Sunday, Dec. 14 at 3 and 5 p.m. and senior high youth will begin the journey, uncovering a scroll telling a prophecy about the lineage of Christ. They will learn about the passage in the Bible (Isaiah 11:1) that foretells the Savior's coming from the root of Jesse. Audience members will then move to one of three areas to hear more of the story: kindergarten through second graders will share their perspective in the sanctuary, the third through fifth graders will share in the center wing, and the preschool children will tell more of the story in the Youth Center. What's so different? Aside from traveling from site to site, this year we will have all ages involved in the same Christmas program. We will have more than 150 ministry partners involved in this year's program. In addition, this year's program has been written by the ministry staff.

Imagine: Let Your Light Shine

Gloria Dei is passionate in being courageous in outreach. A few years ago a group from Gloria Dei founded the Shining City Foundation, which has provided humanitarian aid to those less fortunate. Below is an article from one of their representatives, who has helped with the work in China:

Imagine you and your family live in a tent with a dirt floor. Your only heat comes from the fire in the middle of the tent. The only light you know is that of the fire, the sun, and the moon. You have never traveled farther than you can walk.

You have no money, and don't need any, because there are no stores to shop and nothing to buy. You do not have a job, because your only job is to produce everything needed to survive. Your children do not go to school because there is no school. Your health care consists of folk medicine. You eat only milk, cheese, butter, and barley. The only toys you have are the ones you have made from sticks and rocks. You have no electricity, radio, newspaper and TV.

And you have never heard of God or his Son Jesus.

staple food. And you own a vicious dog that protects you. You are content and feel so fortunate for what you have; you offer prayers and sacrifices to multiple gods of folk religions passed on from your ancestors.

Can you imagine anyone living like this? I couldn't, until I witnessed it with my own eyes. The first time I experienced such living I prayed to God to help me act so that I never again felt the shame of doing so little to help others. God tells us in Matthew 25:40 that *whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.* I have come to believe that it is not the humanitarian support we provide that will enhance the lives of those less fortunate; it is through humanitarian efforts that we enhance their lives as we introduce people to the concept of a Creator God, and his Son Jesus, who died for all of us, even those that may not know him yet.

Have you ever considered who introduced the concept of God and Jesus to you and/or your family—possibly last month or centuries ago? Think about what your life would be like if you did not know of God and Jesus—to know grace, hope, forgiveness, and life eternal.

Through mission work at Gloria Dei we have an opportuni-

ty to bring the Gospel to life—to introduce people to Jesus Christ for the first time, and for a lifetime.

We do this when we deliver a solar generator, light bulb, and radio to a yak herder who has never had electricity. We do this when we knit a hat that is placed on the head of child who has only known frostbite and cold.

We do this when we buy a calendar and the proceeds go to provide food supplies for orphans we will never meet.

In Matthew 5, Jesus shares with us the Beatitudes, and then He tells us: You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.
