### Stewardship

One of the great blessings Gloria Dei has experienced is the generous giving of our members towards the growth of God's kingdom. Since 2000, our total congregational giving has gone from a little less than \$900,000 annually to almost \$1,500,000 during the last fiscal year. That is an increase of over 60 percent! God has truly blessed us.

While the increase in giving is important, it is more important what is accomplished with those resources. Consider the exciting things

that have happened over that time period:

- We have opened a thriving Christian preschool which serves almost 100 children weekly.
- We have added the Northwind worship service on Saturday evenings, which 150-200 people weekly attend - allowing us to reach people in unique and exciting ways.
- We have supported missions worldwide. In the last year, a group from Gloria Dei made their third trip to Honduras on a medical mission trip that also brought Christ to the poor and needy in that country. We supported the building of a Christian church in China where none had existed. We made a second trip to Uganda to train and support the growth of the church there and funded a trip for two members of that church to the United States for additional training and support. None of these missions was active just five years ago.
- We have added support groups and care ministries where few existed before to serve the needs of our members and members of the community.
- We have grown our audio/visual capabilities to the point where we are now hosting concerts and other events in our facility and in the community as another way to reach people with the good news of Jesus Christ.

While the congregation and community have been blessed, so have those contributing to these exciting activities. Each person that has financially supported our ministry is blessed with the knowledge of what has been accomplished.

Consider the opportunities ahead and the blessings we could enjoy if we challenged ourselves, even in small ways, to further supporting the ministry. What if we could increase the current average family giving from 2.7 percent of income to even 3 percent? Consider the blessings if the fifty percent of our membership that currently gives less than \$5 per week to the ministry committed to giving 1 percent of their income. The opportunities for us to reach people are endless.

God has truly blessed Gloria Dei and we continue to look for new and innovative ways to continue bringing Jesus Christ to people for the first time and a lifetime.

#### **Castaway - Youth**

For our junior high youth in grades 6-8, we have a high-energy educational time, Castaway, in the Youth Center on Sundays at 9:20 and 10:50 a.m.

#### Senior High and Adults

Our senior high youth in grades 9-12 are invited to a study on Sundays from 9-10 a.m. in rooms 134-38.

Adults are invited to join us for an in-depth journey using materials from the Lifelight series in rooms 131-33 from 9:20-10:20 a.m. or a study that parallels the new sermon series from 10:20-11:20 a.m. in rooms 135-37.
