"Recently a member from Gloria Dei asked a business if they could help supply certain materials for the upcoming mission trip to Honduras in June. As the story unfolds, the business had an abundance of lice shampoo that they could donate because they were discontinuing the item. When the team discovered the generosity of the company, they were joyful and astounded at the amount of product the company wanted to donate—9,900 pounds of lice shampoo!

"The team calculated the cost of sending the shampoo to the World Gospel Outreach hub in Houston, Texas and concluded it was cost prohibitive, so they prayed. A few days later, a member of Gloria Dei stepped forward and asked to pay for the entire shipping costs. "As of last Wednesday, the total shipment is on its way to Houston, where it will be shipped to Honduras in January. Praise God for his abundance!"

African Children's Choir Visits Next Sunday



Twenty-six children. Twenty-six different stories.

The African Children's Choir, 26 Ugandan and Kenyan children ranging in ages from six to ten, will perform at Gloria Dei Sunday, Nov. 11 from 7-8:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. Each year a new choir is selected from children who are not only musical, but also who come from some of Africa's most desperate villages where most of them have lost at least one parent to poverty or disease.

After their year tour is completed, the children return home and attend school. In the past, many of the children from previous tours attended universities to become doctors, engineers or other professional leaders in Africa.

Invite your friends and neighbors to this event; there is no reserved seating, so come early. If the sanctuary becomes full, we will have seating in the narthex. A free-will offering will be collected to help the impoverished in Africa.

Facilities Usage

Gloria Dei has been blessed with consistent growth in the last several years. Since 1998, we have enjoyed a 53 percent increase in worship attendance, which equals an average yearly growth rate of 5.9 percent. With that growth comes challenges in trying to accommodate additional people, classes and programs.

If you have visited the church during the week, you will notice a stream of activities and people within our walls. Beyond the activities that we are all



aware of on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings, there is a multitude of other activities here on a weekly basis. These activities include Tiny Treasures Preschool, Women's Connections, Bible studies, Kindermusik classes, support groups including DivorceCare, Grief Share, Breast Cancer and AA. We also host sewing groups, dinner theatres, ministry partner meetings, dance rehearsals, piano recitals, weddings, and funerals. At the same time, part of our vision of GR.A.C.E. is to open our facilities to those in the community as well. We host home schooling groups, community support groups and classes, outside board and committee meetings, elections and a multitude of other activities.

With that in mind, we continue to be attentive to creative ways on how to best fulfill our vision of G.R.A.C.E. using our current facilities. We have added worship services, educational times and parking spaces. To further help with classroom spaces, we moved the board room and created two additional classrooms on either side of the children's library. We are currently using the Family Life Center to hold three grades of classes on Wednesday evenings.

One of the first items of importance for Steve Kammeyer when he joined the staff as Executive Director in June was to evaluate and coordinate all the activities that occur at the church.

"We need to live out our G.R.A.C.E vision in every avenue possible," said Steve. "That involves making sure we have the space needed for the many church activities and programs as well as all the private and community requests that we receive. We spent over three weeks this fall creating a calendar of facility usage to accommodate the continued growth of programs. We have grown to the point of having to tell groups we do not have space to accommodate their requests."

As we continue to live out our vision of G.R.A.C.E. within a growing congregation, we need to realistically look at the current and future demands of our facility and how to accommodate our continued growth.
