

# Flu Updates

We wanted to inform the congregation of a confirmed case of novel influenza A (H1N1) of a child at Tiny Treasures. The parents immediately took proactive steps by taking their young child to the doctor when cold-like symptoms and a fever appeared. Their course of action is to be applauded because it helped their child and lessened the possibility of spreading the influenza at the preschool.

Please be assured that we are committed in taking the necessary steps to prevent the spread of any communicable disease in every area of ministry at Gloria Dei.

We encourage the children and staff to wash hands frequently or use the hand sanitizer provided throughout the building, we disinfect tables, toys, doorknobs, bathrooms regularly and we encourage individuals who are sick to stay home. In addition, Brandon Simpson, Facilities Manager and the cleaning crew has routinely disinfected public areas such as the classrooms, bathrooms, kitchen, Family Life Center and Sanctuary.

"We are doing everything possible to ensure the safety of all of our members at Gloria Dei by taking the necessary steps as prescribed by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)," said Bill Jesse, Executive Director.

We are also in the process of organizing a Ministry Action Team to provide feedback, recommendations, and to develop a written plan to address the issues associated with the spread of communicable disease within the church organization.

### **OSHA Flu Guidelines**

The United States Department of Labor has issued some simple guidelines:

- Stay home if you are sick.
- Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or with a hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your nose, mouth and eyes.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, or cough and sneeze into your upper sleeve. Dispose of tissues in no-touch trash receptacles.
- Wash your hands or use a hand sanitizer after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose.
- Avoid shaking hands and always wash your hands after physical contact with others.
- Keep frequently-touched common surfaces clean (for example, phones, computer equipment, etc.).
- Maintain a healthy lifestyle; attention to rest, diet, exercise and relaxation helps maintain physical and emotional health.

# **Urbandale Pantry Update**

In 2008, Pastor Burcham was involved with the startup of the Ministerial Alliance of Urbandale and the City of Urbandale to create a DMARC food pantry for the local residents in need. Gloria Dei's Beacon of Blessings soon became involved with overseeing monthly collections earmarked for the pantry and Naomi Circle collected monetary donations twice a year.

The following is an update from the Urbandale Food Pantry Coordinator, Eileen Boggess:

"As the months have progressed, so has the need for services. When we first opened our doors, we supplied approximately 125 families (350 individuals) from Urbandale and Windsor Heights with a five-day emergency supply of food each month. During the month of July, we provided approximately 160 families (469 individuals) with an emergency supply of food. We have also provided each of these families with a personal product bag that contains shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, toilet tissues, feminine hygiene products, diapers and laundry soap."



We are thankful for the service that the pantry provides to those in need. We will continue to support them by our monthly donations of requested items and by our monetary donations. (Please note: Naomi Circle will provide DMARC envelopes in the Weekly

Word later this fall.) Meanwhile, feel free to drop off October's suggested item of laundry detergent in the Urbandale Food Pantry box in the narthex. Thank you for your continued support!


