## Making G.R.A.C.E. a Reality

Vision is a preferred picture of the future. In late August, I used my basement remodeling job as an example of vision. Before we began our project, Michelle and I chose a final design. We had to visualize it as if it were completed. Then, once we agreed on our vision, we acted accordingly. The same is true for our church; seeing what we believe God wants us to accomplish gives us the motivation and desire to make it a reality.

The vision of our congregation is found in G.R.A.C.E. This acronym is two-fold. First, it describes our ministry's foundation of God's undeserved love, and second, each letter depicts a unique aspect of our vision:

Grace, Relationship, A Beacon, Courageous and Equipping. In the last five weeks, each aspect of that vision has been examined in order that we might visualize Gloria Dei's future more concretely. In reality, it isn't too difficult—we see huge glimpses of it with each passing year.

**Growing:** People are growing in their faith and relationships with God. Three years ago we averaged 750 people in worship each week; this year we are averaging 950. In addition, Bible study groups, weekend and midweek educational times have increased.

**Relationship:** While the size of our congregation increases, we are growing smaller thanks to our small group ministry, fellowship activities and additional worship services. We can enjoy the blessings of a close-knit community while reaping the benefits and resources of a large congregation.

A Beacon to our community: We are integrating into our community. When I wear a shirt that has our logo on it, I hear "You're the church where my daughter takes her children to Kindermusik" or "I

was in your place last week to vote" or "My neighbor takes her children to your pre-school." We are being known for more than "that large church on the corner of 86th and Aurora."

Courageous in outreach: In the last two years, the majority of new members have stated that a friend or neighbor told them about our ministry and invited them to join in. In addition, youth and adults have reached out during mission trips to New York, Kentucky, Honduras, China, Russia, Mexico, and Uganda. We also support lots of local and foreign missions.

Equipping Center: Last week after the message, I received an e-mail from a member about her four-year-old daughter. When the daughter heard that her mother's friend's grandmother had died, she replied, "Tell her not to be sad. Tell her Daddy will take care of her grandma in

heaven. He will show her around and make sure she sees all the good stuff." From our youngest to our oldest members, we are making the connection between God's word and our daily lives.

God has called us to make the vision of G.R.A.C.E. a reality. Throughout the years, we see him changing lives, including our own, and I believe we have the privilege and responsibility to further the vision God has entrusted us with. What an exciting time for us as we look at the picture of what God wants for us in the future, and diligently work toward it!

By the way, when I wrote that original article in August, I challenged you to ask me about the status of our basement remodel at the end of this sermon series. Yes—it is completed. We are enjoying our new space because we followed our vision for what it would become. One day, our congregational vision also will become a reality—it all starts when we see in our minds what we can become.
