Reflectors of Light

I recently read a story about sailors and twin lighthouses. As you know, lighthouses are noted for having powerful lights that give off continuous signals to ships at sea in order to help sailors navigate at night. These twin lighthouses stand about 50 feet apart. Interestingly, there is a powerful light in one of the lighthouses, but the second has only prisms and reflectors

second has only prisms and reflector that mirror the light from the other. Yet, from a distance, they both appear to shine brightly. Both lighthouses have been placed to provide light to travelers at night even though they have different components.

As travelers here on this earth, we read in Matthew 5 about Jesus telling us, the church, something very remarkable: "You are the light of the world." Jesus is telling us that all who believe in him are lights in this world. In essence, we are to be concerned not for our-

selves but for those around us who are traveling in darkness. There is a need for Jesus' light in this world. The darkness of this world makes that which is good seem evil, and that which is evil is then promoted as being good. Jesus is calling us as individuals and as a church to be Christian lights; lights shining brightly to help others see and navigate through their lives.

A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. Matthew 5:14-15

Where do we get this "light" that Jesus calls us to shine? God's Word is the source of our light and life. It is through God's Word that we are given the light of faith, which exposes the deeds of darkness. Through the Word, we find all we need to know about him and his love. It is shining in the face of Jesus Christ, who came as a light so that all who believe in him need not travel in darkness. Jesus hung on a cross in the forsaken darkness on that Good Friday afternoon in order to deal with all the evil for us. Then, on that first Easter morning, Jesus

revealed to us the light of the glory of God through his resurrection.

In essence, we are to be concerned not for ourselves but for those around us who are traveling in darkness.There is a need for Jesus light in this world." God enables us as a church to reflect and mirror his light in our lives similar to the second of the twin lighthouses. We, too, have been placed specifically for the purpose of shining brightly to our families, friends, and those in the community. It is all done with the goal to allow those traveling in darkness to see the light of Jesus. How do we do that?

Francis of Assisi once invited a young monk to join him on a trip to town. Honored to be given the invitation, the monk readily accepted. All day long he

and Francis walked through the streets, byways and alleys. They rubbed shoulders with hundreds of people. At day's end, the two headed back home. Not even once had Francis addressed a crowd, nor had he talked to anyone about the Gospel. Greatly disappointed, his young companion said, "I thought we were going into town to preach." Francis responded, "We have preached. We were preaching while we were walking. We were seen by many and our behavior was closely watched. Preach the Gospel all the time. If necessary, use words."

We shine Jesus' light when our neighbors see us backing out of the driveway on our way to worship. We reflect Jesus' light when we purposely do not engage in office gossip. And sometimes, we might even use words to tell people about Jesus Christ, who is the true light.

Sharing Grace: Worship Trends

Since the inception of Gloria Dei in 1963 when eight families worship in Olmsted



Elementary school, we have been blessed to share God's grace to a growing congregation. Since 1998, we have enjoyed a 53 percent increase in worship attendance, which equals an average yearly growth rate of 5.6 percent. The good news is that this trend shows no signs of slowing down. In fact, 2006 attendance was 15.9 percent higher than 2005.

God certainly has blessed us. If this growth continues, let's say, at a rate of 3.5 or 5 percent annual increase, Gloria Dei will be worshiping at 1200 within the next three to five years.

The Strategic Planning Ministry Action team has been analyzing and studying the implications of such an upward trend. Research maintains that attendance will not exceed 80 percent-full at the service with the highest attendance. For the sanctuary, that means 400, while the Family Life Center meets that same threshold at 240. Additionally, parking lot guidelines tell a similar story. Each space accounts for 1.75 people, allowing the current parking lot of 355 spaces to accommodate 621 attendees.

Similarly, this research matches growth patterns found at Gloria Dei. When an additional worship service or parking lot spaces were added, worship attendance increased significantly as displayed in the chart below.

As we plan for the future, we need to take the research and our own history into consideration as we make room to share God's grace with as many people as possible for the first time and for a lifetime.
