No Lone Rangers Here

So in Christ, we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12:5

Circle the word "belongs" in this Bible verse, that's right, go ahead circle it. The Apostle Paul is telling us that we belong to each other. Throughout Scripture we see that if you're a Christian we are all inter-related, connected. We belong to each other. Christianity is a life and so it is to be shared. The point that this verse is making is that every Christian not only needs the Bible, not only needs prayer, but every Christian needs other Christians. There's no such thing as "lone ranger" Christianity. We need each other.

That's what we've been focusing on these last few weeks in our sermon series, "Life in Community." We've learned that God has created us for community and through community we receive the support we need as we go through our daily lives. Today we will explore how community helps us grow in our relationships with God and with each other.

Have you ever thought about how people grow? Babies start life with only a few abilities, such as crying and eating. Within a year-and-a-half they are walking and talking.

How is that possible? It is a miracle that most of us pay little attention to. Their amazing growth is largely due to the people who surround and teach them many things. Their physical and mental growth continues for many years until finally they are adults. When they become adults, we say that they are mature.

Jesus calls us to become spiritually mature. In order for us to do that effectively, we must develop spiritually. Worshipping with other Christians and attending church regularly will help us grow. But there is more to it. We need to share with others our problems and joys, to hear their struggles and blessings, to learn how to apply the Scriptures to our lives by being able to interact, ask questions, apply and share insights with each other. That's what we need in order to grow in our faith. That's what community groups are all about.

Again, the basic principle of community is that we need each other. We need to spend time with others who know and love the Lord as we do. Some people remain baby Christians after many years. This is not God's plan. God want us to become mature. He wants us to grow spiritually tall, "reaching to the very height of Christ's full stature" (Ephesians 4:13). And so we shall!



Overseas Mission

For the last several years, members of Gloria Dei have been called to bring Jesus Christ to the remote parts of China. Working with partners such as the Shining City Foundation, our efforts in the remote mountains of China have included development of:

- medical / dental clinics in areas where there was previously no health care,
- schools where children can go to learn for the first time,
- generators that brought electricity and light to people for the first time, and.
- basic essentials such as quilts made by the Stitchin' Mission and hundreds of hats knit by Cheryl Gilg, and her friends, that have gone to children that had no blankets or hats.

God has richly blessed us with an unprecedented opportunity. In an area of remote China that is now growing with new brothers and sisters in Christ, we at Gloria Dei were able to fund their first Christian church. Through Gloria Dei's

mission support, we are providing financial resources for the materials, and our brothers and sisters are providing the labor. God's new church will take the place of a wooden barn with a dirt floor where people would walk several days to come and worship. People are still making the trip and they will now be arriving in a beautiful structure that glorifies God and provides the opportu-
