Building character

As we continue in our "Leading an Effective Life" series of messages, we will learn more about the qualities listed in II Peter 1:5-7:

For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love.

This week Pastor Burcham will share the importance of perseverance in our Christian life. As we are aware, living this side of heaven can be

challenging, if not, painful at times. We pray, we try to live a life that honors him but sometimes suffering, persecution, sickness and sorrow camps out at our doorsteps. We try to ignore or jump over these obstacles, but their persistent jabs cause even the strongest to grow weary.

Meanwhile on the sidelines of our turbulent roads is a God, who is cheering and strengthening us.

In my alarm I said, "I am cut off from your sight!" Yet you heard my cry for mercy when I called to you for help. Psalm 31:22

God sees our struggles and will help us. He encourages us to rely on him, so that we can persevere through the situation in front of us. Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Hebrews 12:1-3

God encourages us to persevere, to go the distance in our journey with and for him. He doesn't want us to commit spiritual asylum from him

and defect into the snares of the world.

Since God created mankind, he understands our tendencies and leanings when rocky times beat on our doors. Therefore, Paul writes on the benefits of running the race when suffering is at our heels.

Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and charac-

ter, hope. And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us. Romans 5:3-5

From my perspective, when I am annoyed by the bumpy road and am ready to jump off course, it is reassuring to know that the friction caused from the turbulent obstacles will actually produce godly attributes and character.

Our current vision of G.R.A.C.E. was born seven years ago when staff and members began discussing and praying about Gloria Dei's future. They believed that Gloria Dei should encompass the following five benchmarks:

During that time, they set some goals to correspond with the new vision. Today as we look back, we are extremely thankful for the

goals that have been met.

We have increased our staff by adding an executive director, directors of worship, media, preschool, adult, congregational care, publicity and promotion, and numerous part-time staff. We have also added a Saturday night worship service, broadened our types of worship services and added two additional educational times for children and youth. We have expanded the parking lot, made new outside signage along with numerous other facility remodeling efforts. In addition, we raised money to purchase an organ and even trained ministry partners to create a beautiful stained-glass window for the Narthex.

In 2003, we developed our logo and branding campaign. A year later, we established a Christian preschool, which now enrolls almost 100 children. In 2005, we installed overhead projectors for the Sanctuary and continue to develop our multimedia capabilities. To help equip other churches, we brought two men from Uganda for worship training and held a multi-media worship conference. To be a welcoming neighbor, we offered a July Fourth concert in the park this year.

We are extremely thankful to the Lord for his blessings and the vision that was cast to help us get to where we are today. Making goals and plans helped us to bring Jesus Christ to people for the first time and for a lifetime. But where do we go from here? We believe that we are at a crossroads and need to take some time to consider where we should be in the next five to ten years.

We are asking for your prayers as several ministry action teams continue to discuss and pray about how to continue the ministry that the Lord has entrusted to us.

Pastors help local churches

China Update

Deb and Dan Timmons and Scott Raecker recently returned from China and Tibet where they gathered progress updates on a church that Gloria Dei is supporting. The new church will replace a wooden barn where the locals are currently worshiping.

During a mission trip, questions sometimes arise from experiencing a diverse and oftentimes, impoverished culture. The following from Deb Timmons are thoughts written after her trip:

I am still trying to process and figure out "why" God sent me to Tibet as I continue to struggle with so many questions.

Why is there so much poverty? The people daily gather food and basic supplies just to exist. They have no running water and only an open fire for heat in their homes.

Why do they have to live in such harsh conditions with extremely cold temperatures, high altitude, and mountainous terrain that makes travel so difficult?

Why have I been blessed with so much—a beautiful home with running water and heat, more food and warm clothes than I need, a car that makes transportation easy.

Why are there so many health issues? People can die from a simple cut because there is no access to health care or medicines. AIDS is prevalent because of a culture of sexual promiscuity. Why have I been blessed with the assurance of the best health care and best medicines the world has to offer?

And most importantly, why does this entire nation of beautiful and gentle people worship such a false and empty god and have never heard about Jesus and the eternal life he offers? Why was I blessed to have been raised in a Christian home and have the assurance of eternal life?

The differences between our worlds were really brought home to me when I found out while in Tibet that my Uncle Vernon had died. Even though I was very sad, I had such comfort in knowing that Vernon had the assurance of eternal life. A couple of days later we came upon a huge landslide that had wiped out several homes and killed those in its path. These people died without the knowledge of Christ and eternal life and their families members didn't have the comfort and assurance that I do.

Only God knows the seeds that were planted in the hearts of the Tibetan people during our trip. I am not sure what God's plan is and how we can continue to plant seeds half way around the world. But, I am confident he has a plan and I feel so incredibly privileged to be a part of it.
