Geometry works well in building a house, but not in a relationship. Oftentimes

Mid-year financial report

First half of fiscal year financial report July 1-Dec. 31, 2009

The following article is to report an accurate and clear picture of our finances for the first half of the fiscal year. The budget report is divided into three areas: 1.) Total income comprised of offerings and other income. 2.) Expenses. 3.) Cash position. If you have any questions, please call Bill Jesse at 278-5544, ext. 217.

Total income-actual offerings:

The actual offerings were \$805,242, which made up 92 percent of the total income. These offerings were down 1.74 percent or \$14,234 from last year.

Total income-actual other income:

The other income was \$70,473 making up 8 percent of the total income. This comes from tuition, building usage fees, leasing our parking spaces to D.A.R.T and interest income. Other income was much higher than last year by \$28,613 or 72.47 percent.

Total income summary:

In summary, the total income comprised of the actual offerings of \$805,242 plus the other income of \$70,473 equals \$875,715. Total income was slightly higher than last year by \$14,379 or 1.67 percent.

Budgeted total income-offerings and other income:

At the beginning of the budgeting process, we try to determine dollar amounts for both the offerings and the other income based on historical data. We project a figure for each quarter based on the offerings and other income received the previous fiscal year. When we compare the budgeted total income of \$900,512 with the actual total income of \$875,715, we are behind.

Expenses:

Expenses of \$824,433 were down compared to last year's expenses of \$860,177. Expenses were down significantly from this year's budget projection of \$909,254. Expenses were less than the total income received, which shows we are living within our budget. This was not due to any cuts in ministry area programming. Considerable time was spent in the preparation of the budgeted line items of each ministry area to reflect projected actual expenditures.

Cash position:

Our cash operating position is strong and we have not needed to transfer funds from our savings accounts to cover expenses. We are growing our savings accounts. We have financial backing for all of our allocated accounts and are systematically growing our strategic planning account.

In summation, offerings were down and lower than what was projected in the budget. Other income was up, but less than what was budgeted. Expenses were down and significantly less than what was budgeted. Cash in our operating account is sufficient to meet our financial obligations, and we are systematically increasing our savings accounts.

The convention meets every three years and affords the opportunity for leadership to worship, fellowship, vote on bylaws and recommendations from commissions and establish theological positions of the LCMS, to which Gloria Dei belongs. This is Pastor Burcham's third time as an elected delegate for the convention.

"It is neat to see the church at large seek God's will and wrestle with complex issues in the spirit of unity and mutual respect," said Pastor Burcham.

This year's convention will extend three days longer to allow time to consider and vote on the recommendations from a four-year study by the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Synod Structure and Governance. Pastor Burcham has been asked to attend one of the national meetings regarding the Task Force to be held in Minnesota this weekend. The meeting will discuss the Task Force's 21 recommendations to help further the mission of LCMS churches.

World Gospel Outreach (WGO) is celebrating 25 years of serving Christ in Honduras. The founders, Allen and Dona Danforth, did not know all that God had planned through this ministry when they recognized

his call. Now as they reflect on these 25 years, they are grateful for the opportunity to witness God faithfully carrying out his divine purpose through so many people. They write that God amazes us as we reflect on how:

He has taken the medical/evangelism team experience from one small team in January 1989 and has grown it to almost 800 team members or about 10,000 over the past 19 years.



Last year youth from Gloria Dei helped with children's ministry.

He touched a small number of Hondurans at the first medical/evangelism brigade, and increased that number to 500,000.

He blessed us with our Rancho Ebenezer property in 1997. The first three families moved there in 2000 and 68 people live there today.

He provided the funding to build Ebenezer Academy for grades PreK-12, so children could receive a well-rounded education.

He helped provide the resources for La Casa de Esperanza, the new facility to house mission teams.

He allows WGO to be his hands and feet to serve people where they need medical, optical and dental care. More than 2,500 Hondurans came to know Christ last year alone.


